



CDSBC appears in BC Supreme Court re: Tung Sheng Wu

Today CDSBC returned to the BC Supreme Court to report on its seizure of Tung Sheng Wu's vehicle and to seek orders concerning some of the items seized. CDSBC also applied to conclude its contempt proceeding against Mr. Wu, despite the fact that Mr. Wu has not yet surfaced to respond to the allegations made against him.

Mr. Wu did not appear today. The Court decided not to immediately proceed in his absence, and has provided Mr. Wu a final opportunity to respond. The hearing is now scheduled to proceed on October 9, 2013, whether or not Mr. Wu appears.

While CDSBC would have liked to conclude this case today, we recognize the seriousness of proceeding and potentially sentencing someone without them being present. We believe that by giving Mr. Wu one more chance to appear and respond, the Court is sending a clear message that the possibility of a severe penalty exists in this case.

The Court granted permission for CDSBC to return Mr. Wu's leased Acura vehicle to Honda Canada. Additionally, CDSBC located in the vehicle some dental equipment that had gone missing from a training course. CDSBC was granted permission to return these items to their rightful owner.

The Court also granted permission for CDSBC to communicate with the Canada Revenue Agency concerning financial records seized from Mr. Wu.

CDSBC will now serve its final materials on Mr. Wu's last known addresses, and will return to Court to conclude this matter on October 9.
