1	Between 2010 and May 2012 in your communications with dentists on contract at the clinic you owned and operated and staff and/or patients of the clinic, you <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Used profanity; b. Made derogatory comments to or about women; c. Raised you voice and/or displayed unreasonable anger; d. Behaved in a physically aggressive manner and/or intimidating manner and, or in the alterative, e. Permitted persons known as M and Mr. G to behave in a manner toward clinic dentists and/or staff which you knew or ought to have known was aggressive and/or intimidating. 	Professional misconduct
2	Between 2010 and March 5, 2012, you made disparaging statements about the treatment provided to patients by clinic dentists. These statements were made to patients, clinic dentists, and/or clinic staff.	Unprofessional conduct
3	Between 2011 and March 5, 2012, you failed to operate the clinic in a manner consistent with the standards expected of a competent registrant as illustrated by one or more of the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. You wrote one or more cheques when you knew or ought to have known the cheque could not be honoured due to insufficient funds in the bank account upon which the cheque was written; b. You delayed and/or failed to make payments of salary and/or benefits owed to clinic dentists and/or staff; 	Professional misconduct in 3 (a), 3(b) and 3(d) 3(c) dismissed due to insufficient evidence

You caused cheques payable to clinic dentists for patient treatment to be deposited to accounts that you owned or controlled without their consent, or otherwise withheld cheques from clinic dentists and, or in the alternative, d. Having promised a refund to patient Mr. S, you then refused to provide it. 	
4	Between 2011 and March 5, 2012, you failed to adhere to infection control protocols by permitting persons into the clinic operatories, namely those persons known as M and Mr. G, who were not patients and who were not registrants and whose presence was unrelated to patient care.	Unprofessional conduct
5	<p>Between 2011 and March 5, 2012, you failed to adequately protect the confidentiality of personal patient information by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Permitting patient charts to be left unsecured; b. Removing records from the clinic; c. Allowing patient records to be left outside the clinic; and, or in the alternative, d. Permitting persons who were not registrants and/or whose presence at the clinic was unrelated to patient care, namely those persons know as M or Mr. G to have access to patient records. 	<p>Unprofessional conduct in 5(a)</p> <p>Allegations 5(b), 5(c) and 5(d) unproven.</p>
6	<p>Between November 2011 and January 2012, you provided inadequate dental services as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. You cut the tongue of a patient Mr. H, during treatment, so badly that he required emergency care; and/or b. You abandoned a patient Mr. R, in the operatory. 	<p>6(a) dismissed due to insufficient evidence</p> <p>6(b) constituted unprofessional conduct</p>
7	In or about December 2011, you caused clinic staff, Mr. R and/or Ms. L to assist in distributing written solicitations for dental treatment at a condominium complex in Burnaby, thereby	Unprofessional conduct



	causing clinic staff to enter private property without authorization.	
8	In or about May 2012, you caused mail addressed to one or more clinic dentists to be diverted to a post office box to which you had access, or, in the alternative, you retrieved mail addressed to one or more clinic dentists from a post office box, when you did not have their consent to do so.	Professional misconduct
9	After you were suspended from the practice of dentistry by order of the Inquiry Committee made March 5, 2012, you offered to provide dental treatment to the public by: a. Causing an advertisement to be published in the June 15, 2012 edition of the "Burnaby Now" newspaper; b. Causing an advertisement to be published in a June 2012 Burnaby Board of Trade publication; and, or in the alternative, c. Displaying signage on a vehicle.	Professional misconduct in 9(a) and 9(c) 9(b) was dismissed for lack of evidence
