ORDER

Under Section 37.1 of the *Health Professions Act*

After considering the Consent Order Proposal to the Inquiry Committee of the College of Dental Surgeons of British Columbia (the “College”) submitted by the Registrant, Dr. Narendra (Randy) Narayan (the “Respondent”) on October 10, 2013, attached; and after considering the Respondent’s admission to all of the allegations in the Citation issued August 22, 2013 (the Citation), attached; and after noting the seriousness of the allegations in the Citation which establish a pattern of incompetent practice and professional misconduct by the Respondent, the Inquiry Committee orders that:

- (a) The Respondent is reprimanded;
- (b) The Respondent’s registration with the College is cancelled;
- (c) Before the Respondent can apply for reinstatement of his registration with the College, he must :
 - (i) Provide a report from a physician or physicians pre-approved by the College confirming his mental and physical fitness to practise dentistry;
 - (ii) Complete the fourth year of dental school, including satisfaction of any examinations, at an institution approved in advance by the College;

- (iii) Satisfactorily complete the National Dental Examining Board examinations (written and OSCE); and
 - (iv) Satisfactorily complete (pass or pass with conditions) of Professional/ Problem Based Ethics course provided by The Centre for Personalized Education of Physicians;
- (d) The Respondent must indemnify the College for its costs of the investigation of the various matters leading to the Citation in an amount fixed at \$1,000.00;
- (e) Should the Respondent be reinstated upon satisfaction of the conditions set out in (c) above, the following conditions are imposed on his practice of dentistry:
- (i) For the first 24 months after resuming practice, the Respondent may only practise in association with another dentist approved by the College;
 - (ii) For the first 24 months after resuming practice, the Respondent must provide the College with quarterly reports from his physician or physicians with respect to his mental and physical fitness to practise dentistry;
 - (iii) The Respondent must enter into a monitoring and inspection agreement with the College for a period of 24 months from the date of resumption by him of dental practice by which:
 - patient chart reviews are conducted every six months; and
 - the monitoring/inspecting representative of the College will report to the Inquiry Committee on findings for further action as may be reasonably necessary.
