

**IN THE MATTER OF THE HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT, RSBC 1996 c. 183**

**IN THE MATTER OF THE COLLEGE OF DENTAL SURGEONS OF BRITISH  
COLUMBIA AND  
MR. LESLIE WINICK**

**ORDER**

Under Section 37.1 of the *Health Professions Act*

After considering the Consent Order Proposal (the "Proposal") to the Inquiry Committee (the "Committee") of the College of Dental Surgeons of British Columbia (the "College") submitted by the former registrant, Mr. Leslie Winick (the "Respondent") on May 12, 2014, attached; and after considering the Respondent's admission to all allegations in the Citation issued March 18, 2014 (the "Citation"), attached, except as set out in paragraph 3.1 of the Proposal; and after noting the seriousness of the allegations as admitted in the Citation which establish a pattern of incompetent dental practice and professional misconduct by the Respondent, the Inquiry Committee orders that:

1. The Respondent is reprimanded;
2. The Respondent will indemnify the College for a portion of its costs of the investigation of the various matters leading to the Citation in an amount fixed at \$1,000.00, payable within 120 days of any reinstatement of the Respondent with the College;
3. The Respondent will not apply for reinstatement with the College before August 15, 2014;

4. Upon any reinstatement with the College, the following limits and conditions are imposed upon the Respondent's practice of dentistry:
  - a. Satisfactory completion of a full-time, (35 hours per week) four-month supervised practice period, or the part-time equivalent thereof, during which time:
    - i. The Respondent will only practise as an associate under the direct supervision of one or more dentists approved by the College, including supervision within an approved study club or clubs environment;
    - ii. The direct supervision consists of the supervising dentist reviewing and overseeing any and all diagnoses, treatment plans and treatments and indicating satisfaction with the clinical results. The scope of supervision can be adjusted as the period of supervision progresses as agreed to between the College and the supervisor;
    - iii. The Respondent will enter into an agreement with the College confirming all aspects of this practice supervision period, including confirmation that the supervising dentist(s) will report to the College on a regular basis as to the Respondent's practice standards and requirements for further action as may be reasonably necessary.
  - b. Satisfactory completion of the National Dental Examining Board examinations (written and OSCE) at the first opportunity after satisfactory completion of the supervised practice period, with one opportunity to repeat an examination in the event a passing standard is not achieved;
  - c. Continuous membership and participation in at least one College-approved study club for a period of no less than five years from the date of reinstatement;
  - d. Entering into a monitoring and inspection agreement with the College for a period of 24 months following completion of the supervised practice period, which agreement will provide for:
    - i. patient chart reviews being conducted every six months;
    - ii. office inspections as deemed necessary by the College; and
    - iii. the monitoring/inspecting representative of the College will report to the Committee on findings for further action as may be reasonably necessary.
  - e. A doubling of continuing education requirements for the cycle during which the Respondent is first reinstated, such that no fewer than 180 credits are reported at the end of that three-year cycle; and

- f. Undergoing an assessment by a physician appointed by the College following completion of the supervised practice period with respect to his mental and physical fitness to practise dentistry, and provision by that physician to the College of a suitable report.
